### The Gaza Crisis – from Cafod

Please help to stop the violence in Gaza and provide aid to families who are in great need. Write to the Foreign Secretary, The Right Honourable Philip Hammond, asking him to show stronger support for a comprehensive and permanent ceasefire, to help secure humanitarian access to the people who are suffering and to work with other Governments to find a long-term solution to the Israeli – Palestinian conflict. The address is The Foreign & Commonwealth Office, King Charles Street, London, SW1A 2AH or simply **sign the Cafod petition** on the table at the back of church. "We have to continue tirelessly to pray for peace but prayers alone are not enough. There must also be a serious effort to reach a peace accord." Bishop William Shomali, Auxiliary Bishop of Jerusalem. **All monies in the World Needy box, from now until the end of September, will go to Cafod for the relief of suffering in Gaza.**

### Parish Property

Last summer, Father Joseph commissioned a survey of the parish property. This was restricted to the church building itself so it did not include the presbytery or the parish grounds. I received the report in late autumn. Its findings can be summarised as follows.

Repairs "of the utmost priority" are estimated to cost £37,500. Other repairs which are "important and should be addressed within eighteen months" are estimated to cost £30,960. The total repair costs over five years are estimated at £100,000 inclusive of V.A.T. and fees.

At this point, I have not taken the matter any further but we do need to start thinking seriously about this before too long. It is not something I am qualified to do on my own. Please think about volunteering your help and advice, especially if you have a particular expertise. Thank you. *Father Michael*

### Celebration of the Word with Children

This is the more accurate term for what is often called "Children's Liturgy". Whatever you call it, **this is a very important and valued part of our Sunday worship**. It provides the opportunity for the children at Sunday Mass to reflect on the Sunday scripture readings and to pray at a level appropriate to them. At a brief meeting, earlier this year, with the present team of people involved in this important ministry, I was asked to appeal for more volunteers to help with it. Most of the people involved have been doing it for a long time. Some are no longer able to do it and gaps are appearing when it is not possible to celebrate it. **Please think about becoming involved**. You will not be left on your own but will work with others who are experienced. As stated elsewhere in this newsletter, in September, Simon Stewart is giving a two-part series here on this subject. This is a golden opportunity to find out more without committing yourself!

## Read next Sunday's Gospel for the Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time (24<sup>th</sup> August)

### Matthew 16 : 13-20 Jesus claims Peter as rock.

At last, Peter recognizes that Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ. At last, he realises that, in Jesus, he can see the action of God made visible. The disciples followed Jesus as soon as he called but, for a long time, they were puzzled about what to make of him, of his wonderful teaching and his godlike personality. Now comes a shaft of light and understanding. We, too, often take some time to appreciate the true worth of someone we know well: a little gesture can sometimes reveal just how generous and thoughtful they are. Peter suddenly grasps that here is the Son of God, acting among them, a daunting or even terrifying thought. Jesus replies to Peter's recognition with his own generosity, giving him a new name, 'Rock', for this is what 'Peter' means. If you name something, you make it your own, take it to yourself. This is just what Jesus does with Simon who becomes his own Peter, his own 'Rock'. That is the importance of the naming of a child at Baptism: Jesus takes us to himself and we become his. The early Christians called themselves 'Those over whom the name of Jesus has been called'. We may have been named Mary or John, but the name of Jesus has been called over us and we have become his.

**What are the implications for us of Jesus' promise to Peter?**
