## *The Parish Patronal Feast*

At a Parish Pastoral Council meeting earlier this year, the subject of the date of the Parish Patronal Feast was raised. For many years now, certainly since Father McMahon's time, it has been celebrated on 8<sup>th</sup>. September on the **Feast** of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It was suggested by some that a more suitable date would be 15<sup>th</sup>. August, the **Solemnity** of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Please note that the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is **only** a **feast**. This means that it cannot take the place of the Sunday Liturgy. In the hierarchy of things, the Sunday Mass has greater importance. But, the Feast of the Assumption is a feast of the highest rank i.e. it is a **Solemnity**. A Solemnity is of higher rank than a Sunday in Ordinary Time and, therefore, the Mass of the Solemnity takes precedence over the Mass for Sunday.

This means that, if we change our patronal feast to the Assumption, it means we can always celebrate it fully, even when it falls on a Sunday.

When I asked our local expert, Canon Dakin, for advice, he replied, "The Assumption is the most ancient and solemn feast which the Church celebrates in honour of the Virgin. It ought to be the most popular and the most festive feast because it is the principal feast of the Mother of God. This justifies the rule that a church dedicated to St. Mary celebrates its patronal feast on the Assumption."

The Parish Pastoral Council and I therefore suggest that we celebrate our patronal feast this year on Friday, 15<sup>th</sup>. August. A festive Mass at 7 p.m. will be followed by a social gathering. More details to follow!

## Read next Sunday's Gospel for the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (6<sup>th</sup>. July)

### Matthew 11 : 25-30 Father & Son

This much-loved and encouraging passage tells of the intimacy of the relationship between Father and Son in a way that no other passage of the synoptic gospels does. It is reminiscent of those passages in John 5 which unfold the equality of Father and Son: the Son does nothing but what he sees the Father doing; the Father loves the Son so that he entrusts all things to the Son; and the Son gives life just as the Father gives life. Then we read about the gentle invitation of the Son to all who are overburdened. The 'yoke' is often a symbol of the Law of Moses, which could seem burdensome with its many commands, though it was also valued as God's revelation of himself to his own people in love. Christ is not a tyrannical master, but is a sympathetic, gentle and humble leader who shares his life with his followers. The 'yoke' or law of Christ is the interior impulse of the Spirit which we read more about in today's second reading. It cannot be burdensome, since it is a joy to carry this 'yoke'; it is a way of living with Christ and by his Spirit. Martyrs are subjected to physical pains yet, for them, joy is a constant feature in the accounts of their martyrdom.

**Do you ever feel you can't cope? Do you ask Jesus for help? What does Jesus mean by his 'yoke'? Do you find it comfortable?**
