Christmas Mass Times

As last year, the Christmas Mass times will be: **Christmas Midnight** preceded by carols from 11.30 p.m.; the **Dawn Mass of Christmas** at 8.30 a.m. and the **Day Mass of Christmas** at 10.30 a.m.

This is a return to the tradition which originated in Rome in the sixth century, **Midnight Mass** was celebrated in the Basilica of St. Mary Major for the papal household. The **Dawn Mass** was celebrated for the diplomatic corps, especially the ambassador representing the Emperor who, by then, resided in Constantinople. A "**popular**" Mass was celebrated later in the day at St. Peter's Basilica for the people of Rome.

Please could I encourage children to come to the 10.30 a.m. Mass on Christmas Day? They will be very welcome and are invited to bring one of their toys with them (*preferably something small and not too noisy!!*).

Sadly, in the last thirty years or so, the provision of Vigil Masses on Christmas Eve has decimated the attendances on Christmas Day itself. This means that, in a generation, we have destroyed a tradition that goes back for 1,500 years! "Well done us"!!! Or, as an eminent liturgist friend of mine said, "There's got to be something wrong, Michael, when more Catholics go to Mass on Christmas Eve than on Christmas Day." Think about it!

On a practical note, if you are coming to Midnight Mass and have spare seats in your car, please could you sign the list at the back of church? On the other hand, if you want to come to Midnight Mass but need a lift to church, please sign the list for this at the back of church.

Next Sunday's Gospel for the Third Sunday of Advent (14th December)

John 1 : 6-8, 19-28 a voice crying in the wilderness

So, John the Baptist came as a witness to the light. In today's gospel reading, he seems rather to refuse witness. He is quite negative, answering with a stalwart and repeated 'No!'. He witnesses only that 'There is one standing among you whom you do not know'. It is not always easy to find Jesus. All the way through the Gospel of John there are misunderstandings about Jesus; people fail to recognise him for what he is: there's the Samaritan at the well, Nicodemus in the night, Mary Magdalene beside the empty tomb, even Peter and the disciples as they fish on the Lake. We can easily become so wrapped up in our own troubles and worries that we fail to recognise the one figure who can provide the solution to them, although he is standing among us, the one who 'has the words of eternal life'. He may come to us in a way we do not like, as a corrective - blocking or diverting the way we have chosen. He may come as suffering, disappointment, failure or bereavement. All of these may be acts of God's love, to show us the way, though we cannot see it at the time. It is just like John the Baptist, saying steadily 'No!', until eventually we turn around and see Christ as our true light.

How can I find Jesus in the crowded events of my busy life? He often comes in unexpected ways. Is he in the quiet voice of a friend? Is he in the anger of someone I have annoyed? Is he in the rebuke of someone who knows me better than I know myself? Is he in my failures and frustrations?
